COURSE DESCRIPTION

The mission of this cost accounting or cost and quality management course is discussed as a tool of planning and controlling the operation of a business. This course would continue the Introduction to Managerial Accounting. Emphasis is placed on the conceptual, analytical and practical aspect of the subject for better decision making approach. The major topics would include Various Cost Terms, Activity Based Costing, Variances, Balance Scorecard, Capital Budgeting, Transfer Pricing, Multinational, and Performance Measurement.
