

Entrepreneurship Course Number: 33:382:103 Course Title: Accounting for Entrepreneurs and Small Business

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will emphasize the entrepreneur's need to understand and work with financial information. Class time will be divided between lecture and discussing the assigned homework. It is very helpful for students to read the assigned material, prior to the class period when that material will be covered, to get a basic understanding of the new topics and terminology. Students should also attempt the exercises and problems that are assigned, before they are reviewed in class.

Additional accounting material may be covered in an effort to customize, where possible, to the students' entrepreneurial interests. Critical thinking and real-world business issues will also be considered.

COURSE MATERIALS

- 2. Connect Accounting Software (bundled with textbook if purchased from the Rutgers bookstore).

<u>NOTE</u>: Students may purchase the required textbook and software different ways. The textbook, when purchased from the RU bookstore, comes bundled with access to an online version of the textbook, as well as an online homework system called "Connect". <u>Everyone must use Connect to complete selected homework assignments (see below for details)</u>. Alternatively, the required Connect software can be separately purchased directly from the publisher through the Connect website. Doing so includes an online version of the book and the option to purchase a binder-ready version of the textbook from the publisher. Textbook costs should be evaluated along with the cost of the required software to enable the student to make the best, most cost-effective decision.

LEARNING GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

This course is designed to help students develop skills and knowledge which entrepreneurs need so they can understand and work with financial information, evaluate the impact of business decisions and communicate their results. In order to enable the student to do this, the course objectives are to provide an understanding of the use of accounting as a language of business, as a means of recording business activity, and for planning, evaluating and reporting business results.

GRADING POLICY

The final course grade is determined as follows:

60 points Exams 1, 2, and 3 together 30 points Final Exam (comprehensive)

10 points Connect Online Assignments for Credit

All exams are "closed book" and will be given during a regularly scheduled class period. Programmable calculators may not be used during examinations. All cell phones and other electronics must be turned off while taking an exam.

The lowest grade for exams 1, 2, or 3 will be dropped. The two remaining grades will be averaged and that score will represent 60% of the course grade. If a student does not take Exam 1, 2, or 3, the exam not taken will be the dropped exam. There are no makeup exams.

All students must take the Final Exam. The Final Exam is comprehensive and will be given on a date and time specified in the final exam schedule undergraduate classes. If you have a Final Exam conflict within the Rutgers University guidelines, and therefore cannot take the Final Exam as scheduled, you must speak to me about it at least two weeks prior to the exam. If, after discussing your conflict with me, you do not take the Final Exam, you will receive a "TF" grade (temporary F) regardless of your grade average in the course, until you complete the final exam. If you do not complete the final exam, the "TF" will become an "F".
