COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course introduces you to the two core concepts in finance, the time value of money and the riskreturn trade-off, and their applications (e.g. pricing financial contracts, determining the cost of capital, capital budgeting, deciding on capital structure). The objectives of this course are to help you (i) understand the basic tools/constructs/techniques of finance, thoroughly; (ii) understand the assumptions underlying the basic tools/constructs/techniques, and (iii) apply the tools.

LEARNING GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

This course is designed to help students develop skills and knowledge in the following area(s) associated with Working Capital Management:

- b. ability to construct and deliver clear, concise, and convincing oral business reports.

5. **Quantitative Thinking.** Students graduating with a BS degree will understand and be able to apply appropriate quantitative techniques to

- a. analyzing and finding patterns in data
- b. analysis of business decision-making and planning
