

# Professional Accounting Course Number: 22:835:511 Course Title: Business Law II

#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

The first part of this course provides a comprehensive overview of the fundamentals of advanced concepts in the law of negotiable instruments, banking law, secured transactions in real & personal property law, labor law, and bankruptcy. The second half of the course focuses primarily on business structures. Various forms for doing business are studied. They include sole proprietorships, partnerships, limited partnerships, limited liability partnerships, corporations, and limited liability companies—formation, operation, and termination of these entities are examined. In addition, administrative law, consumer protection, antitrust issues, accountants' legal liability, and ethics are also studied.

- 2. **Demonstrate** an ability to apply legal terms and principles relating to business matters.
- 3. **Understand** the principles and concepts critical to success on the CPA examination.
- 4. Analyze contemporary business-related legal issues.

5. **Identify** ethical constrains in business decision-making.

# COURSE METHOD AND REQUIREMENTS

Students are expected to complete all course work in a timely manner and must be prepared to actively participate in online discussions on the discussion board/forum on Canvas. In addition to reading the assigned chapters (and any supplemental material posted on Canvas), students should listen to the recorded lecture for each chapter and complete the exercises assigned on Pearson MyLab. These MyLab exercises will be helpful in retaining the material so that you may do your very best on the exams. Students are also expected to be up to date on current legal issues affecting businesses in order to write a paper on a current business/legal issue.

#### **GRADING COMPONENTS**

**Examinations (60%--***Midterm and Final Exams worth 30%, each)* 

The midterm exam is scheduled as close to the half-way mark of the class as possible. The final exam (not cumulative) will be given during the last week of the term. More information is provided on the Canvas course page.

Make-up examinations are a matter of discretion, not a matter of right. ## Writing Assignment (20%)

Toward the end of the term, students must submit a written paper (2-3 double-spaced, typed pages) analyzing a contemporary legal issue relevant to politics or business – details posted on the Canvas course page.

## **Discussion Posts on Canvas (10%)**

Students will make posts in response to questions posed on the Discussion Board/Forum on Canvas. All posts and discussion should be relevant to the chapter and should provide useful and meaningful information and demonstrate insight into the materials. The posts are evaluated for organization, relevance and insight.

#### Pearson MyLab (Quizzes) (10%)

MyLab is a required component of the course. All students purchase this feature (along with the textbook) and must complete and pass all quizzes on the MyLab website. You must score 70 or above to be deemed to have passed a quiz. Failure to complete or pass any quiz may result in a 2-point reduction from your final grade for EACH missed/failed quiz.

Although I strongly suggest that you complete the quiz for each chapter in the week assigned, you must complete the quizzes for weeks 1 - 3 by the end of the weekend when the midterm is scheduled. Similarly, the quizzes assigned for weeks 4 -7 must be completed by the end of the weekend when the final is scheduled. You are solely responsible for keeping track of, and meeting, all deadlines. \*\*Please make certain that you have a reliable Internet connection when taking exams, Pearson MyLab quizzes, and completing all online work.
